The RTHS Annual General Meeting

The January meeting is our annual meeting to select the Society's executive for the coming year. The committee will present its recommendations at the meeting.

News from the Rideau Branch, Ottawa Archives

The Rideau Branch of the Ottawa Archives is once again starting the new year with a solid core of 15 volunteers, a number we will try to increase over the year. 2009 was a productive year for the Branch. Hopefully we can do even better in 2010.

Large Format Scanner

In the continuing effort to keep abreast of the technology the Rideau Branch has acquired a large format scanner. It was acquired from the main branch of the Ottawa Archives.

The scanner is an Epson with an 11" by 17" bed that will allow us to scan poster size documents at high resolution.

Our Microfilm Camera

Rideau Township Historical Society owns a valuable flatbed microfilm camera, given to us a number of years ago by Xebec Imaging when they got out of the manual filming business.

Since then, the camera has been housed at Rideau Archives, and has made some money for the Friends of Rideau Township Archives (a committee of the RTHS) by contracting microfilming jobs. Microfilm technology seems to have been made obsolete by digital imaging in the past few years, and now the camera sits unused.

It is too good to throw out, but takes up too much room at the Archives. Over the last several weeks volunteers have disassembled the bulky machine and will store it above the Archives vault for the present. This will make room for the new (to us, at least) large digital scanner in the reading room.
