Georgina Tupper wins Heritage Award

Georgina Tupper was presented with a City of Ottawa Distinguished Civic Appreciation Award on May 3, 2006, in recognition of the enormous contribution she has made to her community and to heritage over the years.

Upon moving to a historic stone house on a farm near the village of Kars in 1968, Georgie became interested in the heritage of the area. But she also attributes her fascination with local history to influences in her childhood home of rural Nova Scotia, with its old, interconnected families. This interest, combined with her strong sense of community, encouraged her to become involved in a number of organizations and projects, often in a leadership role.

This tireless community volunteer's many activities include:

- founding member of R.T.H.S.
- former president of R.T.H.S.
- founding member and determined advocate of Rideau Township Archives
- chair of volunteers for the Rideau Township Archives since its inception in 1990
- former member of the Kars Women's Institute
- president of the Kars R.A.
- chair of the Kars Fair
- founder of the Rideau Ballet School
- co-vice president of the organizing committee for the 1983 International Plowing Match held in Richmond
- member of the Parliamentary Wives Association
- member of the Ontario Heritage Association
- trustee of the Ottawa-Carleton Plowman's Association for several years
- researcher for "Kars on the Rideau"
- author of "Followin' the Furrow: A History of Plowing in Carleton County"
- author of the Hyland Family History
- long-time researcher of the founding families of North Gower and Marlborough townships
- member of the Heritage Board for the former Township of Rideau

Georgie feels honoured to receive this award, and feels it really belongs equally to the many volunteers she has worked with. The award is currently on display on North Gower at the Rideau Township Branch of the City of Ottawa Archives.
